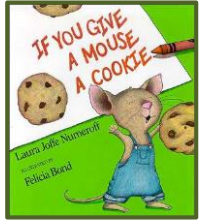


# Ready to Learn Funstuff

Narrative skills are the ability to retell a story or to tell a story in order. (An example of a narrative skill is for your child to tell a story about something he/she did at school.) After reading the book, ask your child the following questions:

- How did the story start?
- Then what happened?
- What happened next?
- How did the story end?

### **If you give a Mouse Sequence Cards**

You will need:

- Sequence Cards (provided)
- Scissors

Parents, ask your child to look at the pictures as you read. Ask your child what goes after the last picture in each row. Have your child show you where that picture is in the book. Now cut apart the pictures and ask your child to put the cards in order as in the book. Have fun!! You're doing a great job, mom and dad!!

### **If You Give a Mouse Card Game**

You will need:

- Game Cards (provided)
- Scissors

Parents, cut apart the Game Cards. Place the cards in a small sack or box. Take turns drawing a card. Read and answer what the mouse **might** want and explain why it goes with the item.
